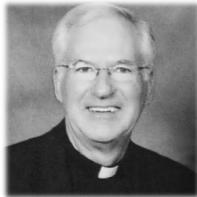

The Family Pantry of Cape Cod

In 1989 a group of ten people from the St. Vincent De Paul Society of Holy Trinity Church realized that they could not keep up with financial aid to people who needed food so they decided to start a pantry. They ran a food drive over the 4th of July weekend, rented a small store front and opened for business on August 8, 1989. They paid the rent on the storefront by collecting bottles and cans which could be redeemed for a nickel!

Fast forward, and the pantry is a non-profit, non-denominational organization, staffed by over 700 volunteers, a full-time executive director, warehouse manager and thrift store manager along with a part time office manager and program manager. The main Pantry is housed in a large warehouse on Queen Anne Road in Harwich MA and in 2017 the Pantry expanded to include the Healthy Meals in Motion mobile pantry serving the lower Cape.



Inspired by Gospel values, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, a Catholic lay organization, leads women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering in the tradition of its founder and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

As a reflection of the whole family of God, members, who are known as Vincentians, are drawn from every ethnic and cultural background, age group, and economic level. Vincentians are united in an international society of charity by their spirit of poverty, humility and sharing, which is nourished by prayer and reflection, mutually supportive gatherings and adherence to a basic Rule.

Saint Vincent de Paul society works very closely with Our Lady of the Cape church in Brewster where they provide food and help for the needy all over Cape Cod. Each year, the parish of Our Lady of the Cape helps to raise money to benefit the food pantries and help those in need of food and clothing.
